Preschool & Elementary School

BRIARGATE PRESCHOOL

The Briargate Preschool, located at the EAC, will be displaying a Veterans Day poster by the water fountain in the preschool hallway. Preschoolers will color a heart-shaped American flag to decorate the poster and we are welcoming veterans to take pictures with their preschoolers by this poster.

ACADEMY ENDEAVOUR ES

Academy Endeavour will be celebrating our veterans by having an all school assembly on Monday, November 11th at 8:40am. We will have our JROTC Color Guard present the Colors. Our very own *Galaxy Singers* will sing the "Star Spangled Banner" and "Sacrifices Made." *The Missing Man Table* will be presented by Mr. Chris Waldrip. Classrooms will be using a Veterans Day Board in Discovery Education to do other Veterans Day Activities.

ACADEMY INTERNATIONAL ES

Academy International will honor our veterans in a whole-school Veterans Day assembly on Monday, November 11th at 9:00am. We are proud to have servicemen and women from the Air Force, Army, and Marines speak to our students. Patriotic music will be performed by Army and Air Force musicians. The Academy International Choir will sing for our veterans, current service members, and students. Major (Army Ret.) Lisa Johnson, a 3rd grade teacher at AIES, will present a slide show of veterans and active duty service members. Family members have been invited to participate in the assembly.

ANTELOPE TRAILS ES

Veterans will be invited to join us on Monday, November 11th for a light breakfast from 8:30am-9:00am where a slideshow of ATE connected veterans will be displayed. The Boy Scouts will post the Colors and then our choir will perform songs for the veterans. Boy Scouts will then lead the veterans on a parade through the school, where students will wave flags they created in Art class. Veterans will then be invited to spend 30-minutes in classrooms visiting with students and answering questions.

CHINOOK TRAIL ES

Veterans Day is an important celebration at Chinook Trail Elementary! Many of our students have family members who have served in the Armed Forces or who are currently serving. The festivities of the day provide a special opportunity to honor those who have served our country.

On the morning of November 11th, at 8:30am, veterans will be welcomed with a reception in their honor, followed by an all-school assembly. A local Boy Scout troop will serve as honor guard; the CTE Tiger Choir will perform; veterans and active duty military will introduce themselves; and, a few students will share what

Veterans Day means to them. After the assembly, our honored guests will be ushered to music and flagwaving by our students in kindergarten through second grade. This assembly, combined with special classroom activities, will help students to better understand the responsibilities of Citizenship – our character trait of the month.

Our Veterans Day festivities allow Chinook Trail students the opportunity to learn from veterans and to honor their sacrifices.

DISCOVERY CANYON ES

At Discovery Canyon Campus Elementary, teachers and students will be honoring veterans in a variety of ways. Kindergarteners will be making paper stars with the help of their parents, honoring a family member or friend that has served in the military. First and second grade students will pay homage to veterans by researching veterans in their family and their service to our country. Students will create a visual tribute for each veteran and display them throughout the school. Third grade students will write letters to a military unit that is currently deployed. Additionally, parents that are, or have served in the military will present to students about their experiences serving their country. Fourth and fifth grade students will write letters, poems, and draw patriotic pictures that will be mailed to veterans thanking them for their service. The students love this activity and often get letters back from the veterans they write. Our intervention teachers will lead lessons about the importance of Veterans Day and students write about what it means to them. Additionally, our librarian has a "Mystery Skype" connecting students with active duty members of our military around the world!

DOUGLASS VALLEY ES

Douglass Valley Elementary will have our annual Veterans Day Parade on November 12 at 9:30am. DVES staff, students, and honored guests will march around the loop on Douglass Drive along with a vintage fire truck, prep school students from USAFA, Eagleview's WEB Leaders, along with wagon floats, and banners. DVES students will be carrying flags donated by the Lions Club and will share the flags with spectators. Following the parade, at approximately 10:30am, there will be a brief program in the gym including a musical performance by our 4th and 5th grade students, a poem recited by our DVES kindergarteners, and a slide show of veterans near and dear to the DVES community. 4th and 5th grade students will hear from WWII Veteran, Bruce Elson, and have the opportunity to ask him questions. Students are also learning about Veterans Day and patriotic traditions throughout the week. Please come join us in your red, white, and blue!

EDITH WOLFORD ES

Our music teacher is already teaching students patriotic songs and will be asking students to work on activity sheets that are related to Veterans Day and patriotic music.

First grade is reading *Veterans Day* by Mindy Sedlik, discussing that the brave service men and women of our country are also our family, friends, and neighbors. They served our country and are now serving in our communities. They will also then create their own mini Veterans Day booklets.

Preschool is making hand wreaths in red, white, and blue and will be giving these to Douglas Valley to share with military families.

SCHOOL IN THE WOODS

The naturalist really enjoy the opportunity to hear from Lt. Colonel DeGaray and ask questions. As a follow-up, thank you cards are written.

EXPLORER ES

Each year Explorer Elementary honors our veterans with a special program. This year the program will be Monday, November 11th starting at 1:30pm. We are honored to have such a large number of active duty and retired military among our Explorer family. Parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and siblings of Explorer students are all welcome and encouraged to attend. Our November 11th program will begin with a cake and punch reception in the cafeteria hosted by Explorer scouts. An all school assembly will begin at 2:00pm in the Explorer gym. The United States Air Force Academy Band Saxophone Quartet will offer special music selections along with the Explorer Choir. During the program, guests and staff members are recognized for their service. The program will end with a slide presentation showcasing active and retired military from all branches of service connected to the Explorer community.

FOOTHILLS ES

At Foothills Elementary we are celebrating Veterans Day to thank our veterans and military members for their selfless service to our country. Our wonderful music teacher, Marlene Crystal, holds a yearly Veterans Day Program where students honor our local veterans and military. This program is titled *All American Me and You* and is performed by our 3rd graders. It will start at 2:30pm and conclude at 3:15pm. In art, each student will make a thank you note with a patriotic drawing on a square piece of paper. This will be compiled into a flag mosaic, photographed and converted into a postcard. During our Veterans Day program when veterans and military are asked to stand to be honored, our third graders will personally deliver their thank you postcards to them. Foothills art teacher, Ellen Enger, has coordinated with Wounded Warriors to give these to local veterans. Also, since we are so blessed to have so many veterans in our Foothills community, our students have personally addressed these to service members in their lives!

FRONTIER ES

Frontier Elementary will provide students with a variety of activities to commemorate Veterans Day and engage them in projects to demonstrate their gratitude for the sacrifice of these men and women. Teachers will use a combination of library, technology, and online resources to provide integrated curricular activities which will culminate in the creation of various writing, posters, and art projects that will decorate the walls of our gymnasium for our annual Thanksgiving Day/Veterans Day Feast on Monday, November 11th. Through these projects, students will learn about the various branches of the military, the history of the poppy and its

significance in honoring our veterans, and how these service men and women honored their country – just to name of few things. John Fenzel is a retired senior Army Special Forces officer (Green Beret) who has served on our nation's battlefields around the world. He has served as a military assistant on the personal staff of the Secretary of Defense, as a Special Assistant to the Vice President, and as a White House Fellow during the Clinton and Bush administrations. John commanded the Special Forces Training Battalion at Fort Bragg, North Carolina and an Army brigade at Fort Knox, Kentucky. In the wake of the September 11th attacks, he served as Staff Director for Tom Ridge in the Homeland Security Council and was the principal architect of The Homeland Advisory System, our nation's color-coded alert system.

In his 30 years of military service, John has served in numerous command and staff positions around the world. During Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm, he commanded a Special Forces "A-Team," training, equipping, and advising a Kuwaiti Battalion and accompanying them during the liberation of Kuwait. He has commanded three Special Forces companies, leading the first Army deployments to Pakistan and the Baltic States. In Bosnia, he commanded the special operations teams in the U.S. and British sectors, working closely with the United Nations to secure the indictments and convictions of those responsible for war crimes in Srebrenica. He is the only active duty American military officer to testify at The Hague in support of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (ICTY).

John is a graduate of the Naval War College and the National War College. Born in Iowa and raised outside Chicago, John lives with his wife and three children in Annapolis, MD. John is the author of three acclaimed novels, *The Lazarus Covenant* (2009), *The Sterling Forest* (2016), and *The Fifth Column* (2018).

During Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm, he commanded a Special Forces "A-Team," training, equipping, and advising a Kuwaiti Battalion and accompanying them during the liberation of Kuwait.
